As part of his white-collar defense practice, Chris has drafted motions to dismiss indictments, negotiated non-prosecution agreements, presented oral argument at sentencing hearings, and represented clients in proffers with the United States Department of Justice.

Chris also has extensive experience in regulatory compliance, with a focus on anti-money laundering, sanctions, and internal audit-related issues. He previously served on the leadership team of a two-year independent monitorship of one of the world's largest banks. As part of the leadership team, he managed a comprehensive assessment of the bank's internal audit function as well as the bank's processes for identifying suspicious activity and sanctions violations.

Prior to joining WHW, Chris practiced law with a top-ranked firm, where he defended businesses throughout all stages of employment litigation. He also served as an intern to the Honorable William D.
